## Call For Religious Equality in Israel

Recently we've seen an increase of police pressure on <u>Women of the Wall</u>, such as the arrest of Nofrat Frenkel, a medical student, in late November, for wearing a tallit while praying at the Wall, and this month's interrogation of Anat Hoffman, director of the <u>Israel Religious Action Center</u> and leader of Women of the Wall.

The <u>URJ has brought together resources</u>, including information and recommended action to enable you to respond to this important issue.

The treatment of women as they engage in meaningful prayer and ritual undermines the Jewish and democratic values that are so essential to the state of Israel's well-being.
