## Attack on Mosque in Israel

<u>In a release</u> on Monday, October 3, the leaders of the Reform movement condemned the Sunday night arson attack on a mosque in the Israeli Arab village of Tuba Zangaria and announced the establishment of a fund that would be used to rebuild the mosque. President of the Union for Reform Judaism Rabbi Eric Yoffie said, "We condemn these acts of hatred in the strongest possible terms. They are inexcusable and do not reflect Jewish values at any time, and are especially reprehensible during these, our high holy days. We stand by the State of Israel in her commitment to bring the perpetrators of these crimes to justice swiftly and to provide safety and religious freedom to all Israeli citizens."

The Religions for Peace Interreligious Coordinating Council in Israel, a coalition of over sixty organizations, issued a statement denouncing the destruction of the mosque as a "desecration of the name of God."
