## "Stand Up for Women's Health" Advocacy

This is a crucial week for women's reproductive health in the Senate budget deliberations. If the draconian anti-Choice bills passed by the House of Representatives are passed by the Senate and signed by President Obama, the impact on women's reproductive health and rights would be devastating. One bill, which is of particular concern this week, would drastically reduce access to affordable abortion services, contraception, pelvic exams, cancer screenings, and other essential women's health care. If passed, it would deny Title X funding to Planned Parenthood and other organizations that provide abortions, although Title X funds are not used for abortions.

The effort to prevent passage of this legislation has attracted a broad range of advocates including <u>Catholics for Choice</u>. Their press release this week states, "In an unprecedented effort, fifty-seven Catholic state legislators have signed a letter urging their counterparts in Congress to keep Title X funding for family planning services in the federal budget. Citing their responsibility as Catholics to protect the rights of the most vulnerable Americans, the legislators say the proposed cuts would unfairly target the poor women who receive contraception and basic preventative health care from Title X funded clinics."

In her March 25th report on the "Saving Reproductive Choice" conference call (sponsored by the Religious Action Center, Women of Reform Judaism, and National Council of Jewish Women), WRJ President Lynn Lazar wrote, "If possible, join the RAC and thousands of pro-choice advocates from around the country on Thursday, April 7, in Washington, D.C., to urge your representatives to oppose legislative attacks on women. Register today to 'Stand up for Women's Health." WRJ thanks those of you who will participate in "Stand Up For Women's Health."
