INTERNATIONAL TRADE ORGANIZATION CHARTER - 1948

Whereas, the proposed Charter of the International Trade Organization, initiated by the United States, and deriving its roots from the Lend-Lease program, the Bretton Woods Agreement and the United Nations Charter itself, is in full accord with the stated economic policies of the government of the United States of America, and

Whereas, said Charter of the ITO will come before the Eighty-first Congress in 1949 for adoption,

Therefore, be it resolved, that the 17th Biennial Assembly of the National Federation of Temple Sisterhoods on behalf of its United States units, urges upon the Congress prompt approval of the ITO Charter, as promoting the best interests of the United States and affording to the nations of the world the benefits of a free flow of international trade and of economic peace.
